<i>Psalm 145 (Ashrei)</i>	429-31			Can be shared with, or offered to knowledgeable family member, friend, etc.

<i>Nishmat</i>	235-241			Often started in unison; continued non-unison. Contemporary option may be shared reading.
<i>Shohen ad</i>	241			New prayer leader until the <i>Shema</i> OR until the <i>Torah</i> Service; student can assist or lead if a good singing voice
<i>Yishtabah</i>	243			Last blessing of the <i>Pesukei D'Zimrah</i>
<i>Hatzi Kaddish</i>	245			Closing blessing; end of the Preliminary Service

<i>Barhu</i> / Yotzer blessing	247			Call to worship; first <i>Shema</i> blessing. Student may lead.
Yotzer / Eil adon/ <i>Kedushah d.</i>	248-69			Non-unison <i>davening</i> , Eng/Heb, traditional melodies. Can select sections or read commentary.
Or <i>hadash</i>	269			Traditional chant or contemporary melody.
<i>Ahava rabah</i> ; <i>V'ha'er eyneynu</i>	270-3			Can be sung or stated, unison or non-unison. <i>Talit</i> fringes are gathered at this time.
<i>Shema</i> ; <i>V'ahavta</i>	277	Song		Student may lead. <i>V'ahavta</i> may be sung or chanted in <i>Shabbat</i> trope.
2 nd -3 rd Paragraphs	279-85			Read silently until the end of the 3rd paragraph.
<i>Vayomer</i> or <i>L'ma'an Tiz-kru</i>	285			Chant in trope; release <i>tallit</i> fringes if not <i>Emet</i>
(<i>Emet Vayetziv</i>)	286-9			(Optional) Non-unison <i>davening</i> ; OR read aloud in English. Introduce the <i>Amidah</i> .
<i>Mi hamoha</i> - <i>Tzur Yisrael</i>	291			Release <i>talit</i> fringes. Stand during <i>Tzur Yisrael</i>

<i>Amidah</i>	295-323			Standing, silently; offer alternatives. OR: First 3 prayers aloud; rest silently OR: Silent; followed by complete repetition
(<i>Nigun</i> , <i>Oseh shalom</i> , or another on Peace) or <i>Kaddish titkabal</i>	107, 381			Song or instrumental music to end, or full <i>kaddish</i>
(Creative moment)				(Optional) Special reading; watch the time.
