### BEGINNING HEBREW

#### Begin with Aleph: Learn to Read Hebrew

This course is for beginners - even those who have "begun" more than once, focusing on basic reading competency. We will also uncover bits of Judaism that are only accessible through its original language. We will use a text that has optional on-line home practice. If necessary, please familiarize yourself with the Hebrew letters before the class begins with the inexpensive on-line curriculum "*Starting With Aleph*" ([www.ejemm.com](http://www.ejemm.com)) OR *Reading Hebrew: A Programmed Instruction Book*, available in the Havurah Shalom office.
